IASPEI - UNESCO WORKING GROUPS

Three joint IASPEI-Unesco Working Groups met during the General Assembly in Hamburg last August. These were on International Experimental Sites for Earthquake Prediction Research, Code of Practice for Earthquake Prediction, and Historical Seismograms.

Reports of all three meetings have been published in IUGG Chronicle (No.165 February 1984), and those on Code of Practice and Historical Seismograms in EOS on 14 February 1984 and 13 March 1984 respectively. The reports on Experimental Sites and Code of Practice are also likely to be published in "Earthquake Prediction Research".

The Working Group on Historical Seismograms, part of the IASPEI Commission on Practice, intends to hold a further symposium at the Tokyo Assembly. Its chairman, Dr W H K Lee, reports the following action in various countries.

Japan	- Historical seismograms from one station are being received for copying at Boulder.
Philippines	- Records from Baguio are being shipped for copying.
Egypt	- A new camera will be sent to Helwan to copy records there.
FRG	- The Gottingen seismograms will be copied.
USSR	- A camera is in use.
China	- An engineer will visit Boulder soon for training.
South America	- A camera has been sent to CERESIS at Lima, where filming will be co-ordinated for the region.

SEISMOLOGICAL RECORDING IN ARAB COUNTRIES

The first permanent station on the Arabian Peninsula has been installed at the University of Petroleum and Minerals at Dhahran, Saudi Arabia. It is a six-component WWSSN type installation.

In Jordan, as well as the station at the University of Jordan in Amman which has been recording since 1981, a telemetered network is to be operated by the Natural Resources Authority. Eight stations are already installed.

Final approval has now been given to set up an extensive telemetered network covering northern Algeria.

These and other planned networks will greatly strengthen earthquake recording throughout the region.

OBITUARY

We record with great sorrow the death on 11 April of Dr E R Lapwood. He had served as Chairman of the British National Sub-Committee for Seismology, and was chairman of the IASPEI Standard Earth Model Committee until its dissolution last year. Ralph died while visiting China, a country for which he had a great affinity, and where he worked for many years as a teacher and later as Professor of Mathematics at Yenching University, before returning to Cambridge University in 1955. He will be remembered not only for his outstanding contributions to mathematics and seismology, but for his able academic leadership and above all for his great kindness and humanity.
